SNAC offers Feral Cat Program

The Lowcountry Spay Neuter Clinic (SNAC) offers vaccinations, testing and spaying/neutering for feral cats to be returned to their habitat.

Residents of Colleton County who are concerned about feral cats in their neighborhoods can borrow cat traps from the Animal Shelter. These traps will allow the cat to be transported to the vet safely.

The feral cat program is \$50 and SNAC will accept the FoCCAS \$25 vouchers to reduce out of pocket expenses to \$25. SNAC can be reached at 843 645-2500.
