SNAC offers Feral Cat Program

The Lowcountry Spay Neuter Clinic (SNAC) offers vaccinations, testing and spaying/neutering for feral cats to be returned to their habitat.

Residents of Colleton County who are concerned about feral cats in their neighborhoods can borrow cat traps from the Animal Shelter. These traps will allow the cat to be transported to the vet safely.

The feral cat program is \$50 and SNAC will accept the FoCCAS \$25 vouchers to reduce out of pocket expences to \$25. SNAC can be reached at 843 645-2500.

Many holiday items can be dangerous to your pets. Food items such as chocolate, yeast dough, grapes, raisins, macadamia nuts, avocados, coffee and alcohol are all harmful to your pets. Non-food seasonal items such as antifreeze, liquid potpourri, ice melts, electrical cords, batteries, human medicines can hurt your pet. Seasonal decorations and especially plants such as lilies, mistletoe, holly, and acorns might poison your pet. **Please be safe!**
